As part of their trip to Ashford town centre, Alpine class visited Ashford Library where they enjoyed a lovely story time.





with some gruesome bits too!' - Will




Pygora Class: The Land of Roar by Jenny McLachlan

Kinder Class: Sam Wu is NOT Afraid of ZOMBIES by Katie and Kevin Tsang






Alpine Class: Space Band by Tom Fletcher

We've got loads for everyone to choose from!




A great way to discover new books we may enjoy is to try recommendations from other readers.




Reading Ambassador Review: The Beast and the Bethany


