Next week in Phonics we will learn: air (as in chair) and er (as in digger)

We will learn these tricky words: are sure pure

We will be starting our Design Technology project of 'boats' next week. The children will be investigating which materials are suitable for waterproofing their boats, making predictions about which materials will float or sink and investigating how the shape of the boat affects the way that they move. The following week, the children will bring home a list of materials that they will need to bring in to make their own boat.

In Maths, we will be finding 6, 7 and 8, looking at different representations of these amounts such as with dots, identifying the numeral or counting any set of objects. The children will learn to find one more and one less than these numbers too.

Please could you continue to practise times tables with your child. We are focusing on the 2s, 3s,4s 5s, 8s and 10s. Please where possible practise these on TTRS. We have started to put the children's logins in the front of their reading records. If your child is struggling to login into TTRS at home, speak to an adult in Kinder class and we will happily assist you. There are also some great videos/songs on the internet to help with this!

PE will be on **Mondays** and **Tuesday**, so children can wear PE kit on these days. Just a reminder that children should be wearing the school PE kit of Goat Lees which is a purple PE top, plain dark bottoms, trainers and school jumper.

Your child will continue to bring home a stage book, please could the book be read twice through to check for understanding and fluency. If your child continues to not bring in their reading record, they will have to stay in to do reading with an adult at playtime as it is so important they read regularly.
