Well done to all of Billy Class for another very busy term at school! They have loved planting seeds this week and doing Easter crafts! Well done to all of those that joined in with the Easter egg competition too.

In Week 1 of Term 5 we will learn the following in Phonics: reading longer words (such as market), words ending in -ing (such as looking) and then compound words (such as rooftop). We will use the chunking method to read longer words which is when we break words into little chunks, sound-talk them, blend and then finally but the chunks together to read the whole word.

We will recap these tricky words: he we me be was you they all

Guided reading and library books will come home during the first week of term, we are keeping them in school over the holidays to check that all have been returned.

Kinder Class - Year 3

It has been a busy, but very productive term. The children have worked very hard and have earnt their time off. The adults in Kinder class want to thank them for all their efforts with their "Mountain" home learning. Their projects looked fantastic and were very impressive.

For Easter there will be no pages of the homework book set. However, we are setting homework based on our topic for term 5 'the Romans'. This is due in on the <u>19 of May.</u> Any questions please come and ask.

Please could you continue to practise times tables with your child. We are focusing on the 2s, 3s,4s 5s, 8s and 10s. Please where possible practise these on TTRS. We have started to put the children's logins in the front of their reading records. If your child is struggling to login into TTRS at home, speak to an adult in Kinder class and we will happily assist you. There are also some great videos/songs on the internet to help with this!

PE will be on **Mondays** and **Tuesday**, so children can wear PE kit on these days. Just a reminder that children should be wearing the school PE kit of Goat Lees which is a purple PE top, plain dark bottoms, trainers and school jumper.

Your child will continue to bring home a stage book, please could the book be read twice through to check for understanding and fluency. When your child has read, please sign and date each day they have read in their reading record.

We will change their books as often as needed to keep up their love of reading! If your child continues to not bring in their reading record, they will have to stay in to do reading with an adult at playtime, as it is so important they read regularly.

Cashmere Class - Year 4

We've had a brilliant term in Cashmere, it has flown by! The children have worked so hard in all the different areas of the curriculum and producing an excellent class assembly. They've thoroughly enjoyed the Science lessons from Mrs Cooper and were able to carry out some experiments to deepen their understanding on the unit.

For Easter there will be no pages of the homework book set. However, please do plenty of reading and continue to practice those times tables! There will be a reward for the top three children who have been accessing TTRS!

Next term, PE will be on **Tuesday** and **Friday**, so children can wear PE kit on these days. Just a reminder that children should be wearing the school PE kit which is a purple PE top, plain dark bottoms, trainers and school jumper/cardigan or fleece.

We will be going swimming every <u>Tuesday afternoon</u> from the <u>second week back</u>. <u>You can pay for this through the Arbor App</u>. This will replace our Monday PE session so please make sure to send your child into school in school uniform on Monday, and on Tuesday send them into school in their PE kit with their swimming gear in a separate bag. The children will need to wear appropriate swimming costumes (not bikinis or crop tops), or shorts/swimming trunks. They will need a towel and goggles (if they wish to use them).

We all hope you have a fabulous break over the half term, and we look forward to seeing you all back for Term 5!
