Billy Class

It's been lovely to see the children back in Billy Class this week!

Next week in Phonics we will be embedding the digraphs and trigraphs that were covered in Term 3. These sounds are: qu, ch, sh, th, ng, nk, ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, ar, or, ur, er, ow, oi, ear and air.

We will also go over all the tricky words with the children as it is crucial that all children can read these before moving on.

Last week and at the end of last term we completed Spring 1 Phonics assessments with the children. Today you will receive a feedback form regarding this assessment as well as highlighted graphemes on a sheet that we would like to ask you to practise at home with your child.

We started our map work this week and will continue with this next week. The children will talk about what they like about the story, 'Martha maps it out,' what they think of Martha and what she might like to do when she gets older, what they like about drawing maps and draw their own simple maps.

In Maths, we will be finding 9 and 10, comparing numbers to 10, representing 9 and 10 and subitising to 10.

We have been given a wonderful opportunity to have a community cricket coach visit our school on a Friday. The children have loved their first cricket lesson this week!

We are really looking forward to World Book Day next week and seeing all the children in their costumes!

It was lovely to see everyone come back so refreshed after their break! This week we have had our photos taken, introduced our new book (The Queen's Handbag), and introduced our new Geography focus 'What is it like to live in the UK?'.

Billy, Angora and Alpine Classes have been treated to a new 'Reading Nook' book area/arch, which they absolutely love! It has already been used lots this week, with the children enjoying this calm, cosy space!

Alpine Class - Year 2

We have had a wonderful first week back from half term, it has been great seeing how much the children have remembered, and we have so enjoyed seeing all their half-term home-learning! What a variety of wonderful pieces of work! Over half term we have been treated to a lovely new reading arch which the children are enjoying!

In our spellings this week we have been focussing on words starting with the /wr/ digraph, and we have started looking at the book 'Flotsam' in our English. This book is unusual because it has no words at all, so we have had to infer from the pictures what is happening. This has opened so many fantastic discussions and we have really been unlocking our imagination! Ask your child the meaning of flotsam and jetsam! In maths we are working on our 2x tables and using our knowledge to help us with halving and doubling.

We had our class photo taken this week and the children all look very smart, don't forget to scan the form that came home, to have a look at the photo!

PE: We are very lucky to have secured a cricket coach to come and work with us this term, which will mean that **PE is now on Tuesdays and Fridays** for this term so please come in PE kits on those days.

Kinder Class - Year 3

We in Kinder class hope you all have had a lovely half term. It has been great to see all the children and they have worked hard this week. We have started our mountain topic and read our new English book the 'Last Tree'

We have set Geography homework based on our new topic of 'Mountains'. This will be due in on the 31 March.

Please could you continue to practise times tables with your child. We are focusing on the 2s, 3s,4s 5s, 8s and 10s. Please where possible practise these on TTRS. We have started to put the children's logins in the front of their reading records. If your child is struggling to login into TTRS at home, speak to an adult in Kinder class and we will happily assist you. There are also some great videos/songs on the internet to help with this!

PE will be on **Mondays** and **Tuesday**, so children can wear PE kit on these days. Just a reminder that children should be wearing the school PE kit of Goat Lees which is a purple PE top, plain dark bottoms, trainers and school jumper.

Your child will continue to bring home a stage book, please could the book be read twice through to check for understanding and fluency. When your child has read, please sign and date each day they have read in their reading record. We will change their books as often as needed to keep up their love of reading! If your child continues to not bring in their reading record, they will have to stay in to do reading with an adult at playtime as it is so important they read regularly.

Cashmere Class - Year 4

It has been great to see all the children back and they've worked hard this week tackling new topics and units of work.

We have started a new story for our English this week - 'Spy Fox'. Ask your child about the story - it isn't a text, we've been luckily enough to study short, animated film this term. The children had Mrs Cooper teaching their PE and Science lesson this week, and that will continue this term, as I'll be teaching History in Year 6! Mrs Cooper is a fantastic scientist and gymnast, so they'll be having a great afternoon with her!

This term we have an exciting opportunity to have a community cricket coach visit our school on a Friday, for the whole of term 4, so we'll be taking the opportunity to make the most of this and will be taught cricket instead of netball and basketball.

Pygora Class - Year 5

This week, we have started our new English book, 'A Crow's Tale' as well as looking at South America in Geography. We also have some other interesting topics coming up including looping and remixing in Music and continuing our work on forces in science.

This evening, your child should bring home a photo permission letter for a project we will be participating in over Term 3 and 4. We have been selected to take part in an exciting opportunity, delivered by environmental charity Global Action Plan, called 'Transform Our World'. This is an initiative running in Kent schools, to help young people act on issues they care about and is funded by the #iwill Fund. More information on what is involved will be on the letter and attached permission slip.

We have a bit of a change in plan with our PE lessons this term, as we have an exciting opportunity to have a community cricket coach visit our school on a Friday, for the whole of term 4, to teach the class cricket. We will therefore be changing our <u>Wednesday PE day to a Friday</u>, so the children will now need to wear <u>school uniform on Wednesdays and PE kit on a Friday</u>. Swimming will continue as normal on Tuesdays.

Our sleepover has nearly arrived! Hopefully the children are getting excited ready for **next Friday**. Here are a few important reminders:

- The children should be collected at the end of the school day as normal and arrive back at school between **5:00** and **5:15pm**.
- They can wear non-uniform but please make sure this is still appropriate for a range of activities.
- They need to be collected on Saturday at 9:00am.
- If your child needs any type of medication in the evening or overnight, please complete a medical form from the office and hand these back to Miss Chapman as soon as possible (so far, I have not had any forms which were due back on the last day of Term 3). Please then hand any medication to Miss Chapman on the morning of the sleepover in a named bag.
- No snacks, food or electronic devices will be allowed.
- The children will be able to sleep on the PE mats if they do not have their own sleeping mat (no blow-up mattresses).
- If your child is not staying overnight, please let me know on drop off, arrangements for when you would like to collect or for us to phone you.
